

RESOLUTION NO. 11-06

A Resolution of the Scientific and Cultural Facilities District  
Pertaining to Recognition of the Scientific and Cultural Collaborative

Whereas, C.R.S. §32-13-107(3)(b)(III) permits the SCFD Board to distribute up to five percent of sales and use tax revenue, which are referred to as “discretionary funds,” to Tier II scientific and cultural facilities that qualify to receive moneys in such amounts as the Board determines appropriate; and

Whereas, these funds are required to be expended on programs or activities that meet one or more of the following statutory factors: regional impact, accessibility, quality, need, enhanced or innovative programs, and collaborations with other qualifying scientific and cultural facilities; and


Whereas, the Scientific and Cultural Collaborative, and its predecessor the Tier II Community Awareness Partnership (CAP), has served the citizens of the SCFD since 1994 via dedicated education programs, services and funding for all ages, by building networking opportunities for member organizations, and by increasing awareness of both the vast cultural offerings of member organizations and the SCFD itself through:


- \* monthly support meetings to discuss, examine, and learn about common concerns,
- \* the Alliance Project – a grant providing curriculum based programs to schools for 15 years,
- \* Education Pathways – funding to off-set costs for admissions, buses, on-campus workshops
- \* the *SCC Directory of Educational Activities for Teachers and Schools* – an annual catalog of over 250 workshops, assemblies, and field trips distributed to all schools in the SCFD and
- \* the SCC Joint Database – a professionally managed database of citizen contacts which may be shared by cultural organizations for increasing awareness and participation;

Whereas, the SCFD Board wishes to recognize and congratulate the Scientific and Cultural Collaborative for its successful collaborations and many years of prudent use of SCFD discretionary funds, and encourages continuing participation by all Tier II funds recipients in the Scientific and Cultural Collaborative;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL FACILITIES DISTRICT, on behalf of the taxpayers of the metropolitan area, hereby commends the Scientific and Cultural Collaborative for its service to the citizens of the District, for strengthening the metropolitan area’s cultural community and for advancing the arts and sciences within and outside the District.
