To Our Constituents:

Year 2002 brought many challenges for the SCFD and the cultural community. The primary focus of the district was developing a plan of action for the SCFD reauthorization—in light of the July 2006 sunset provision. As the district moves forward, this process will take our best efforts regarding discussion, teamwork and inspiration to communicate the SCFD benefits to voters and district citizens.

With the drought, budget shortfalls, transportation, and health care issues taking legislative priority, the SCFD board carefully weighed the pros and cons of introducing an SCFD reauthorization bill during the 2003 or 2004 legislative session. The board concluded it would submit a bill only after a solid agreement on statutory changes had been reached, and the cultural community could approach the General Assembly with a unified voice.

Many steps have been taken regarding the lengthy and complex reauthorization process. The SCFD board held numerous discussions with funded institutions to seek their input into statutory issues. This set the stage for an education process among the SCFD organizations. Growth has been good to the SCFD and along with it comes some challenges. For example, there were a total of 120 recipients in 1989—and in 2002 there are over 300! Limited SCFD staff and resources combined with a pattern of consistent change in SCFD recipients' resources has exerted pressure on everyone and everything, including education, and internal and external communications.

To help address these issues, committees were formed in each of the seven SCFD counties to facilitate discussions and provide feedback. An umbrella committee was formed to provide a district-wide perspective. The political action committee, Citizens for Arts to Zoo, began meeting in Spring of 2002 to develop its agenda to support reauthorization. The Tier I organizations hired a public relations firm, Ciruli and Associates, to coordinate its communication and feedback. Tier II organizations worked with Barbara Neal to assist its executive directors in preparation for subsequent discussions with all SCFD organizations.

One result of this two-way communication is that six individuals emerged to meet and take on the responsibility of holding focused sessions to listen to each Tier's feedback and concerns. To ensure SCFD had a direct line of communication, board chairman John E. Hayes helped facilitate several meetings. Although the SCFD timeline has been extended, the renewal process is complicated and sensitive, and the extra attention to detail is worth the wait.

Economic hardships emerged as the economy softened. Tax collections dropped by 5% and by March 2002 it was evident the \$37 million revenue projection would not be met. Final revenue for the year came to \$35.6 million. Another blow was that the budget for administration relies heavily upon income generated upon the tax revenue. Due to low interest rates, SCFD reduced its administrative budget by 25% even as its growth fueled the service needs of recipient organizations.

As we go to press, SCFD begins its celebration of 15 years of *accountability, fairness and frugality*. Even in difficult times, let's pause to remember the beacon of wonder and joy that the SCFD brings to Colorado. Thank you, citizens, for your vision and generosity. May it carry us through the next 15 years!
