SCFD also aspires to make scientific and cultural events accessible to all citizens of the District. Each year the SCFD family provides over 365 free events and activities for metro area residents! SCFD especially believes in providing access to arts, science and culture for youth. According to the 2012 Economic Activity Study published by the Colorado Business Committee for the Arts (CBCA), programs offered by SCFD funded organizations resulted in more than 4.3 million student contacts.

The SCFD family of organizations does far more than offer enriching experiences, it generates \$1.76 billion in economic activity for the seven county metropolitan area (CBCA) —a figure that demonstrates science and culture not only have a significant impact on our lives, but are economic drivers in the Denver metropolitan area. The plethora of culture available in our community makes the seven county metro area one of the most vivacious places to live!

# **Enriching Our Community**

# Covering 4,542 square miles, SCFD serves an area larger than the states of Rhode Island and Delaware combined!

The Scientific and Cultural Facilities District (SCFD) is the largest funder of culture in the state of Colorado, providing citizens with an abundance of entertaining and enlightening cultural experiences. The SCFD distributes funds from an aggregated 1/10 of 1% sales and use tax to cultural organizations throughout the seven-county Denver, Colorado metropolitan area. In 2012, sales and use tax generated by SCFD totaled \$45,673,156 - the highest revenue collected in the twenty-four year history of SCFD. This \$45 million distributed to organizations has a profound impact on our region.

Since its creation, SCFD has distributed over \$756 million to arts, science, and culture organizations in the Denver metro area and has helped create the vibrant region we all enjoy today.

With a staff of five and only .075% of the revenue collected allocated to administration, SCFD is lean government in action. The SCFD 2012 audited financials can be viewed on SCFD's website, www.scfd.org.



# 2012 Rex Morgan Award



On October 19, 2011, the Rex Morgan Tribute sculpture, created by Colorado artist Patrick Marold, was installed on the Galleria Terrace at the Denver Performing Arts Complex. The eight-foot tall work incorporates art and science with text elements to honor the citizens who comprise SCFD, the recipients of the Rex Morgan Award and the legacy of Rex Morgan. No SCFD tax revenues were used for the Rex Morgan Tribute Sculpture. The sculpture was funded solely through the generosity of donors.

The Rex Morgan award was initiated by the SCFD in 1998 to honor and acknowledge a district resident who embodies exceptional volunteerism, and to inspire leadership and advocacy on behalf of science and culture. Mr. Morgan served as a leader, volunteer and advocate who pursued a regional vision of public support for science and culture. He worked diligently and collaboratively, over the course of many years, to make SCFD a reality. SCFD honors the legacy of Mr. Morgan and those who embody his leadership and advocacy qualities with the Rex Morgan Award.




The 2012 Rex Morgan

# Citizens Making It Possible



In 2012, the average district resident contributed approximately \$16 in tax revenue to SCFD, a small price to pay for free cultural opportunities every day of the year! These funds were distributed to 284 organizations with the purpose of providing access and enriching experiences for the benefit of you, the citizen.

SCFD funds organizations whose primary purpose is to enlighten and entertain the public through **art**, **music**, **dance**, **theatre**, **botany**, **zoology**, **natural history**, **or cultural history**.

# Free Days

SCFD encourages funded organizations to offer low cost programming which provides all residents of the district access to a multitude of cultural opportunities. Due to SCFD funding, many organizations are able to offer free admission to their events! Free days are listed on the SCFD website.

SCFD funded organizations collectively offer over 365 days of free admissions annually



In 2012, SCFD funded 38 arts organizations. Arts programming ranged from world class exhibits such as the Yves St. Laurent Retrospective at the Denver Art Museum to bronze casting for children at Roxborough Arts Council. Art organizations continually enlighten and entertain the public by offering a vast array of creative programs including: painting, drawing, ceramics,

photography, digital arts, film, textile arts, and many more. Many of these organizations are also responsible for the extensive collection of public art that can be seen around the metro area.

# Zoology

In 2012, SCFD funded 7 zoological organizations in the metropolitan area. These organizations provided citizens the opportunity to learn about many different types of animals and their habitats. One of the highlights of the year was the opening of the 10-acre Toyota Elephant Passage exhibit at the Denver Zoo. In addition to the zoo's emphasis on animals, it has also become a national leader in sustainability efforts. The Denver Zoo has created a Waste to Energy Gasification System that will generate 20% of the zoo's energy from 90% of its landfill waste.

In 2012, SCFD funded 33 multi-discipline organizations. These groups blur boundaries and cross lines providing an array of programming that is both cultural and scientific. The Arvada Center, a regional model, provides multi-faceted programming such as gallery space, large-scale theatrical productions, summer CenterFest series in its outdoor amphitheatre, and creative community classes such as dance and ceramics. Many of these organizations are the region's premiere venue spaces such as the Cherokee Ranch and Castle, the Dairy Center for the Arts, Foothills Art Center, the Lone Tree Arts Center, Mizel Center for Arts and Culture, PACE Center, and WOW! Children's Museum.
