SCFD ELIGIBILITY FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ'S)



What type of oversight should the board of directors provide at least annually?

- Approval of annual budget (see definitions in directions and example documents)
- Approval of year end P&L and Balance Sheet (see definitions in directions and example documents)
- Review organization's tax return
- Create policy and ensure organization has and abides by a nondiscrimination statement

If my organization already has a nondiscrimination statement, do we need to update it to meet SCFD's statement?

• Yes, your statement must be as comprehensive as SCFD's policy.

If my organization has paid staff serving on the board, what should we do?

• Organizations should ensure they have a board approved Conflict of Interest policy to address how these issues should be handled; Staff members should not take part in meetings where their compensation is determined. (See <u>Nonprofit Principles and</u> <u>Practices</u> under Step 2. Start collecting information)

Is it ok to pay a board member to serve on a nonprofit board?

• No, generally board members should not be paid for their service as board members but might be paid for other professional services they provide. (See <u>Nonprofit Principles and</u> <u>Practices</u> under Step 2. Start collecting information)

Can I get SCFD eligibility if my organization is under a fiscal sponsorship?

• No, an organization's financials and governance must be directly under the control of the board of directors.

Can my organization primarily serve Castle Rock or Larkspur, Colorado?

• No, Castle Rock and Larkspur are not in the SCFD district. Organizations based there and those doing programs there cannot use SCFD funds.

When will I get SCFD funding?

• If an organization becomes eligible, it may apply for funds during the next spring cycle (March-April). There is a separate funding application, and eligibility does not guarantee you will be funded. You will be contacted about this process.

Can I apply for SCFD funding as an individual artist?

• Unfortunately, no, according to the law that governs SCFD. Colorado Creative Industries (coloradocreativeindustries.org) and Arts and Venues Denver (artsandvenuesdenver.com) may fund individual artists.
