WHAT WE DO

SCFD is the Scientific and Cultural Facilities District, a tax collected and distributed to 300 cultural organizations in our seven-county Denver metro region including Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson counties. Just one penny on every \$10 spent in the district creates vibrancy for us individually and collectively, supporting wonder wherever we go. It gives our kids a unique perspective and understanding of the world. It inspires all of us to discover the radical and the beautiful, and stretches our capacity to be transformed. Our metro area would not be the vibrant, nationally ranked metropolis that it is today without the cultural funding and economic impact created by SCFD. Residents understand this and have approved continuing the tax at each of three renewal elections. With more than \$85 million granted in 2024, our community is enriched by an amazing tapestry of arts, culture, and science that is available and accessible to everyone. Beginning with taxpayers and with the expert shepherding of the SCFD, our collective mission is simple: **We fund culture.**





Message from the Executive Director and the Board Chair

Thanks for tuning in to SCFD's 2024 annual report, *Unwavering Wonder*! In 2024, the district was proud to support more than 300 nonprofit organizations in their efforts to engage the Denver metro area in arts, culture, and science programming. Our funded partners were on the same wavelength when it came to providing discounted admission, hundreds of free days, and a variety of innovative programs to people in all seven SCFD counties, all year long. That led to more than 12 million music classes, art exhibitions, dance performances, citizen science projects, and much more thanks to their efforts.

The world has changed a lot since SCFD was first voted on by district residents in 1988, but there's one thing that has remained constant: the unwavering pursuit of wonder in our community. Our funded partners have found unique and exciting ways to diversify their programming, amplify new voices, and reach broader audiences year over year, and residents continue to show up for the organizations they love. It's been inspiring to see how all of us here in the region are dialed in to this overarching desire to be inspired, to come together, and to create.

And it is this sense of unwavering wonder that has allowed SCFD to provide culture for all for more than 35 years, thanks to the public's support through four elections. Just one penny of every \$10 of sales and use tax collected in the district goes toward the nonprofit organizations that make our cultural sector feel like home for so many people who live in the Denver metro area. All those pennies added up to \$85 million in funding distributed to organizations across the district in 2024. It's true that together, **we fund culture.**

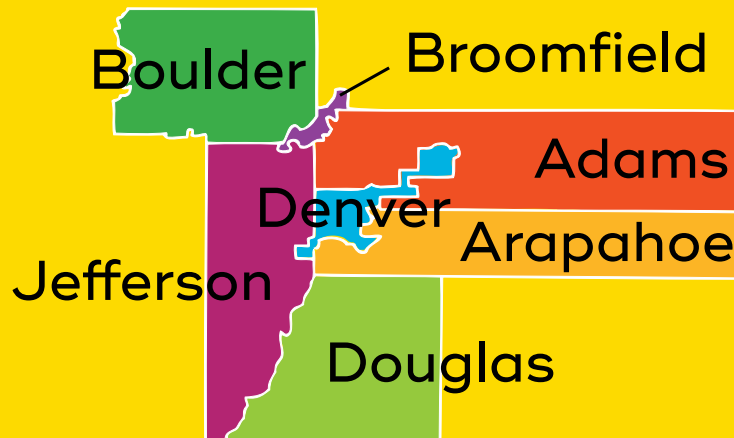

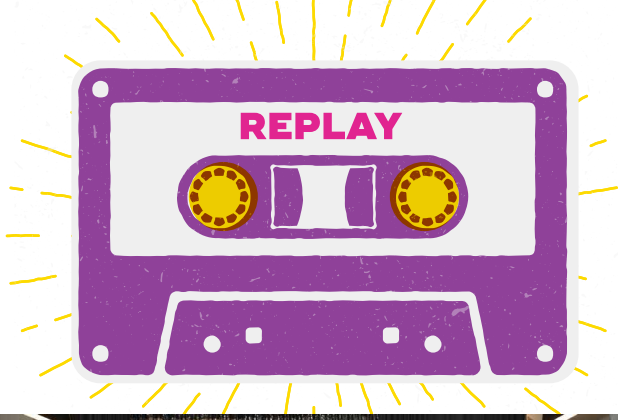

2024 Rex Morgan Awards

SCFD accepted nominations for the biennial Rex Morgan Awards, which were created in honor of one of the original advocates for SCFD, Rex Morgan. These awards recognize outstanding leadership, civic engagement and volunteerism, and regional cooperation and partnerships. Nominations were reviewed by a panel of judges from the cultural community including Darrell Anderson, Teresa Valerio Parrot, and Kathy Nesbitt.

The three selected honorees were recognized at the SCFD Block Party & Awards in June 2024, which brought nearly 300 members of our cultural community together in celebration.



HONOREES

George Sparks

Rex Morgan Award for Lifetime Leadership

George has been the President/CEO of the Denver Museum of Nature & Science since November 2004. Throughout his tenure, he has mentored countless cultural and educational leaders and engaged his organization to create a more inclusive museum for all. His passion is public policy, particularly around science and education, which led him to found the Institute for Science & Policy at the museum. In addition, he is a member of the Colorado Forum, Colorado Concern, and serves on the boards of Colorado Education Initiative, Colorado Business Round Table, Colorado Music Hall of Fame, Denver Council of Foreign Relations, and Denver Metro Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Renee Fajardo

Rex Morgan Award for Civic Engagement & Volunteerism

Dr. Fajardo is an author and cultural activist who has spent the last 35 years preserving and promoting the Latino/Mestizo culture of Colorado. She co-founded the Return of the Corn Mothers traveling exhibition, instituted a free cultural concert series at the Aurora Fox with the Colorado Folk Arts Council, and co-authored eight multicultural children's books. She was also instrumental in securing a new home for the Chicano Humanities and Arts Council Gallery in the Santa Fe Arts District.

Motus Theater

Rex Morgan Award for Innovative Partnerships and Regional Cooperation

Since it was founded in 2010, Motus Theater has brought together members of the community from diverse backgrounds and beliefs to facilitate dialogue about the most pressing issues of our time through theater. For example, through its innovative projects, the organization has provided opportunities for individuals who were formerly incarcerated or people who identify as transgender to stand alongside law enforcement and faith leaders in performances of autobiographical monologues about their experiences. Its dedication to utilizing multimedia performance as a conduit to conversation supersedes boundaries in our community.

TUNING IN

Voices of Unwavering Wonder

Our funded partners have provided a range of cultural experiences in all seven of SCFD's counties for nearly 40 years so that residents can experience wonder through arts, culture, and science right in their backyard. Here's a look back at just a sample of the many cultural experiences offered by SCFD grantees in 2024.



Local Theater Company's *The Democracy Cycle*

During the summer of 2024, the Boulder County-based Local Theater Company (LTC) presented *The Democracy Cycle* in partnership with Curious Theatre Company and Gunnison Theatre Festival. Over the course of LTC's previous season, members of three communities (Boulder, Denver, and Gunnison) gathered to discuss the challenges and successes of their regions via "story circles". A playwright was present during each session and captured the stories shared in a corresponding short play. These plays were presented in each community through staged readings, which sparked community conversations about democracy, society, and what it means to call a place home. The program was such a success that it inspired a new annual program called *Local Listens*, which will kick off in fall 2025 with *Local Listens: Queer Lineage*.



Adams County Arts & Culture Commission's Multi-Vocal Painting Project

In May 2024, the Adams County Arts & Cultural Commission unveiled a stunning, “multi-vocal” piece of art made by nearly 200 students in collaboration with local artist, Mollie Hosmer-Dillard. Over the course of six months, Hosmer-Dillard led workshops at seven schools in Adams County where students worked together to identify issues that concerned them including homelessness, mental health, and war. The students painted seed-shaped tiles to represent the interconnected nature of their personal experiences and these global issues, which Hosmer-Dillard laid out in the form of a sound wave to capture the students’ voices. This collaborative artwork is now displayed at the Adams County building.



HawkQuest's Participatory Raptor Lectures

The Douglas County-based HawkQuest houses and cares for more than 30 birds of prey that can't be returned to the wild. Volunteers bring these raptors to participatory lectures across the region, which allow residents to experience birds of prey up close and learn about their importance to the ecosystem. In 2024, HawkQuest presented more than 40 lectures at local schools, Plains Conservation Center, and Senac Creek Nature Center. As a result, nearly 3,000 students and nature center visitors were able to interact with HawkQuest's raptors.



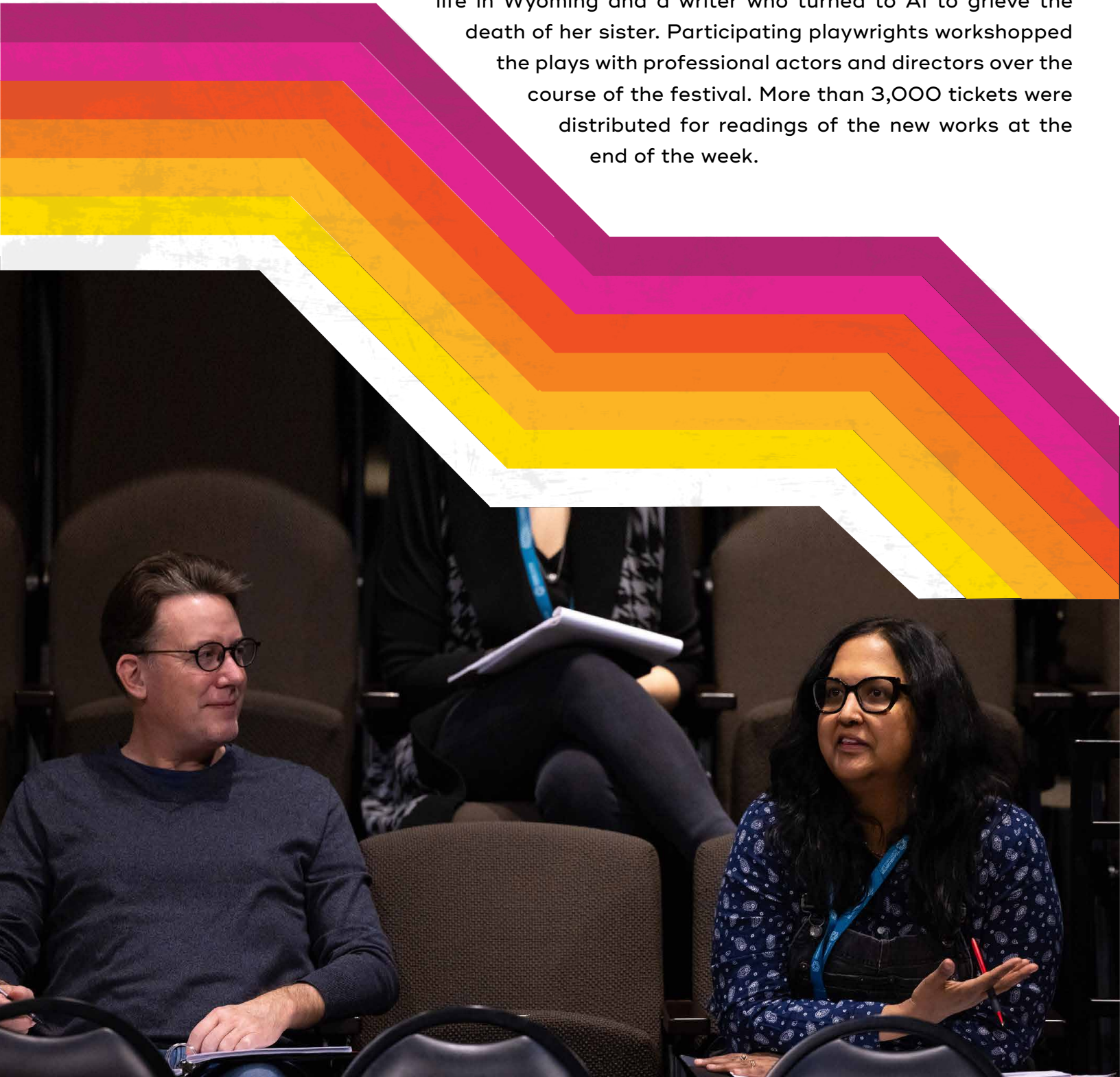
Lighthouse Writers Workshop's Writing with Cancer Program

Since 2017, Lighthouse Writers Workshop has partnered with UCHealth to host free workshops for people who have been diagnosed with cancer and their caregivers. In 2024, more than 60 people attended these workshops. Thanks to the generosity of Lighthouse member Imran Shah and Colorado Associates in Medical Physics (CAMP), last year Lighthouse was able to launch an additional weekly cohort model of the program, which allowed participants to connect more deeply. One participant shared, “It was a chance to open to feelings and thoughts I either don’t share about cancer with many others or didn’t even know that I had. Imran and the other writers created a safe space. For me, it was a home of support...”



Denver Center for the Performing Arts' Colorado New Playwright Summit

By the end of the 2023/24 season, Denver Center for the Performing Arts (DCPA) had offered readings of nearly 80 new plays through its Colorado New Play Summit since it was started in 2005. The 2024 summit featured readings of four new works, all of which told the unique stories of a range of characters including an Indian family navigating life in Wyoming and a writer who turned to AI to grieve the death of her sister. Participating playwrights workshopped the plays with professional actors and directors over the course of the festival. More than 3,000 tickets were distributed for readings of the new works at the end of the week.



Butterfly Pavilion's *Monarch Magic* Exhibition with CHAC Gallery

Butterfly Pavilion launched its annual *Monarch Magic* exhibition in partnership with the Chicano Humanities and Arts Council (CHAC) in November of 2024. This month-long exhibition featured the ecological importance of monarch butterflies and their significance to Mexican culture. Hundreds of monarch butterflies were released into the butterfly conservatory, and exhibit guests were able to visit a community altar or “ofrenda” by CHAC, as monarchs have come to symbolize the souls of deceased loved ones within the tradition of Día de los Muertos. Over 1,300 altar cards in remembrance of loved ones were turned into the exhibition’s ofrenda.



Museum of Outdoor Arts'

Cabinet of Curiosities and Impossibilities

The Museum of Outdoor Arts (MOA) reopened the *Cabinet of Curiosities and Impossibilities* at Marjorie Park, a permanent exhibition exploring whimsical fairytale and nursery rhyme relics designed and created by local artist, Lonnie Hanzon. The Cabinet is housed in a standalone structure built into the Lion's Den at Marjorie Park, allowing visitors to fully immerse themselves in the installation of fairytale-inspired objects and artworks. Later that summer, the exhibition served as a unique backdrop for a production of "Impossible Things" by The Catamounts and Hanzon Productions. To this day, local artists can display their works through temporary exhibitions and activations in the *Cabinet of Curiosities and Impossibilities* at MOA.



Kantorei's World Premiere Commission – “Song Offerings”

Kantorei presented a collaborative performance with Grammy Award-winning composer, Christopher Tin, in a performance of Tin's choral music including the world premiere of a commissioned piece called “Song Offerings”. This work was based on a collection of award-winning poems by Rabindranath Tagore. The commission was supported by Judith Kay Fredericksen and Linda and Randy Chilcote in memory of their daughter Alison N. Roman, a former member of Kantorei. Tin shared, “I decided to approach this piece with a hefty dose of ‘70s zeitgeist after spending many hours contemplating Rabindranath Tagore’s ‘Gitanjali’, which in a way, is one of the most uninhibitedly beautiful treatises on joy that I’ve ever read.” As the first US choir on the prestigious Decca Classics label, a recording of “Song Offerings” will be released to the public in the fall of 2025.



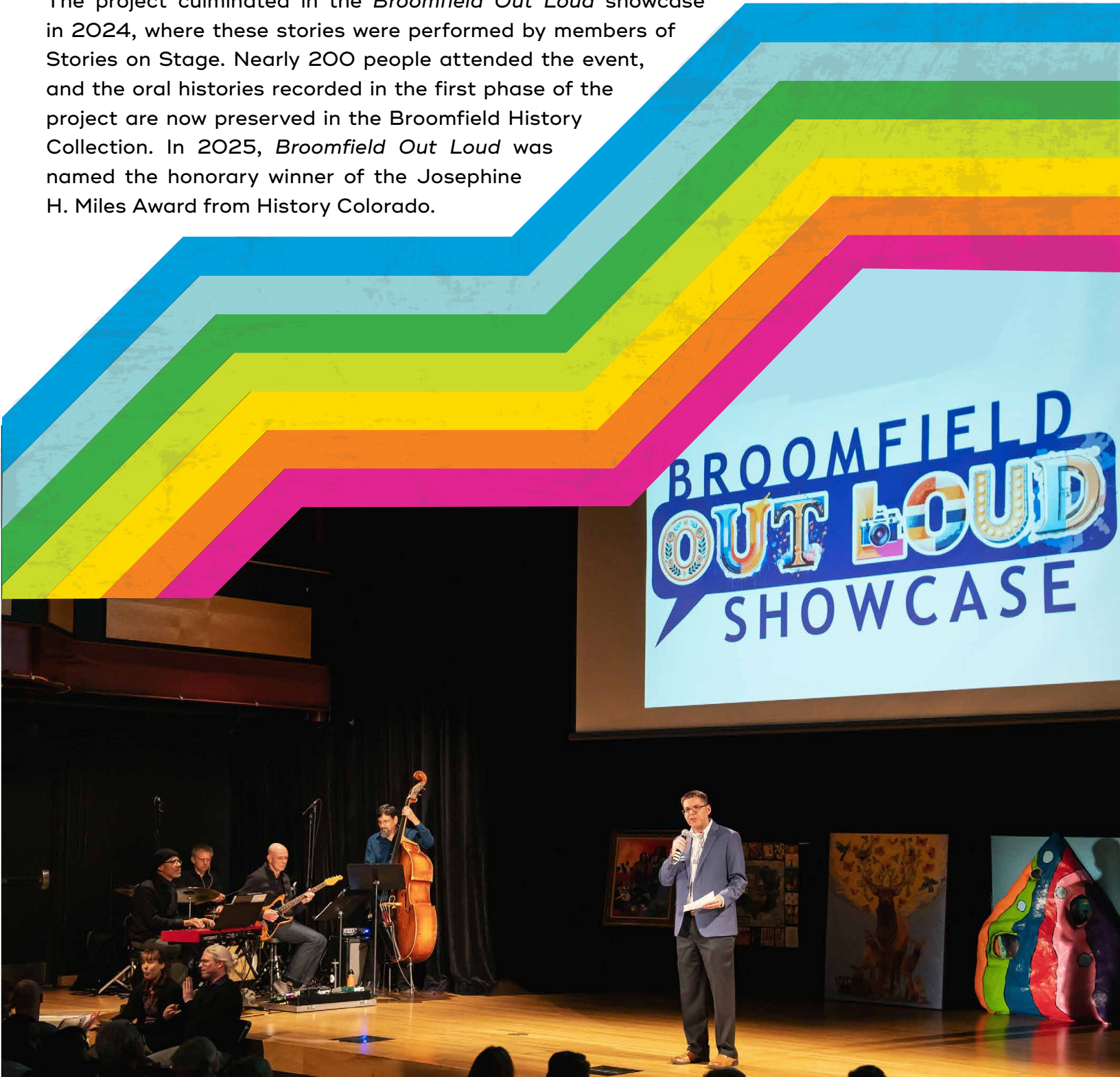
Denver Botanic Gardens' Striped Coralroot Orchid Discovery

During the annual Denver-Boulder City Nature Challenge, a graduate student researcher at Denver Botanic Gardens discovered a rare striped coralroot orchid blooming at Chatfield Farms. This orchid species had never been documented there before! Denver Botanic Gardens is the lead organizing institution for the local City Nature Challenge, which allows people all over the world to observe and document biodiversity where they live. The discovery through this unique citizen science project allowed the Denver Botanic Gardens team to collect a specimen for the Kathryn Kalmbach Herbarium, which made it searchable and available to the public.



City and County of Broomfield's *Broomfield Out Loud Oral History Project*

Last year, the City and County of Broomfield's Arts and History team put together *Broomfield Out Loud*, a project dedicated to telling the stories of Broomfield residents. The project began in late 2023 with a storytelling workshop in partnership with Lighthouse Writers Workshop. Following this workshop, the Arts & History team recorded 65 oral histories from community members. Ten storytellers were selected to be paired with artists who interpreted their stories into works of art. The project culminated in the *Broomfield Out Loud* showcase in 2024, where these stories were performed by members of Stories on Stage. Nearly 200 people attended the event, and the oral histories recorded in the first phase of the project are now preserved in the Broomfield History Collection. In 2025, *Broomfield Out Loud* was named the honorary winner of the Josephine H. Miles Award from History Colorado.



Denver Film's CinemaQ Film Festival

Denver Film's CinemaQ Film Festival celebrates queer voices, visions, and visibility by showcasing LGBTQ+ cinema. CinemaQ's 16th anniversary launched the Black Lives Queerly, or "BLQ" (pronounced Black) program in partnership with Black Pride Colorado, cementing CinemaQ as a safe space for Black LGBTQ+ youth and centering QTBIPOC voices. Last year's festival featured several new events through this program, including a panel discussion by Black queer creators, networking for creatives, and a selection of curated film screenings. More than 300 people attended the "BLQ" program's offerings at the festival, with one attendee sharing, "I honestly went into this (my first time attending this festival) feeling like I would just be seeing some queer film, and it was truly kind of life-changing for a number of reasons. Very grateful for this programming and festival."
